Quick facts about Enable

1 October 2014 - 30 September 2016

6 partners, 5 countries; with the support of the European Commission, industry and researchers worldwide ENABLE (European Network Against Bullying in Learning and Leisure Environments) aims to tackle bullying in a holistic way, helping young people exercise their fundamental rights in the home, school, class and community.

The project will be implemented in a half dozen countries across Europe, work with 6,000 young people aged 11-14 years, empower 2,000 parents and teachers, and be integrated in at least 30 schools.

ENABLE teams with leading researchers from across the world. The project is based on the premise that well-being in today's information and knowledge society calls for sound social and emotional skills, built through a deeper understanding and a responsible approach to on- and offline social interactions. In a nutshell, well-being means resilience or the ability to view even the negative through a positive lens.

Research Phase - 1st semester to end

GOALS:

- Research bullying, including its prevalence, risk factors and consequences;
- Scope impactful actions designed to influence educational policy and practice.

Resource-building Phase - 2nd semester to end

GOALS:

- Develop greater empathy (social and emotional learning SEAL) and improve the self-esteem of young people;
- Develop innovative digital tools to reduce the frequency and impact of bullying incidents.

Peer Mentoring Training and Outreach -

3rd semester to end

GOALS:

- Provide support and easy access to resources for teachers, students, parents, and helplines;
- Train teachers, pupils and parents, building on the findings from the first phases of the project using a cascade model to multiply reach and impetus.
